Research interests

In my dissertation I examined the differences between the two distinct languages, Blackfoot and Lithuanian, for evidence of how roots acquire their lexical categories.

I have researched the question of how grammatical categories like number and gender are variously expressed. An interest in the forms of determiners and expression of definiteness cross linguistically lead to an examination of definiteness in languages without overt articles. A current project concerns the study of iconicity in ideophones and the grammatical categories they take in different languages.
